

Client Bill of Rights

Minnesota Board of Psychology

Patients of psychologists licensed by the state of Minnesota have the right:

to expect the psychologist is qualified by training and experience as required by state law.

to read the public records kept by the board of psychology. These records contain the credentials of a psychologist.

to be told the cost of services before receiving the services.

to privacy as defined by rule and law.

to be free from discrimination on the basis of race, religion, gender or other unlawful category while receiving services.

to have access to their own records as stated in subpart 1a of the rules of conduct and Minnesota Statutes, section 144.355, subdivision 2.

to never be exploited for the benefit or advantage of their psychologist.
